**Leaf Collection:** The City of Muskego Public Works Department will again be picking up leaves starting the fourth week of October through November 30th. Leaves should NOT be bagged. More information can be found at www.cityofmuskego.org or contact the Public Works Department at 262-679-4128.

Leaf Burning: As we approach leaf burning season, remember the burning restrictions in Muskego. Before you light your leaves, or any other yard waste, be sure to: check that the wind speeds at Mitchell International are below 15 mph; that the fire is at least 20 feet from any water's edge, water way or ditch; and is at least 50 feet from any structure or power line. Oh, and make sure you get along with your neighbor, because if the police department receives a complaint that the smoke or smell is bothering someone, they will be asking you, very nicely, to put the fire out.

**Snow Plowing:** Just a reminder that while we are getting ready to enjoy the fall colors, winter is just around the corner. Remember that winter parking restrictions begin on December 1st. That means that parking is not permitted on city streets between 3:00am and 7:00am. So make sure you avoid the pain of a parking ticket, and keep it off the street.



**Be A Good Neighbor:** Over the year we have had complaints about garbage cans, trailers, boats, etc. in the front yard and if you check your bylaws, you will see that they are valid. If a neighbor has a complaint, they must issue that complaint

#### in writing

to the board. The board will then issue a letter to the owner's violation and fines can be assigned if measures aren't taken to correct the violation. Each violation can be fined \$50.00 per month and will go towards a lien against the property. Please be respectful of your neighbors and our bylaws to protect our property values.
